Vehicles longer than 19 feet/5.8 meters are not allowed on Lava Point Road. Unpaved roads are impassable when wet.

Beyond this point, road not plowed in winter.

Unpaved roads are impassable when wet.

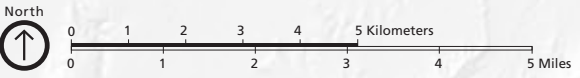
Vehicles pulling trailers not recommended. Narrow winding road with steep grades. Upper section not plowed in winter.

Spring through fall, the Zion Canyon Scenic Drive is open to shuttle buses only. Private vehicles are not allowed beyond Canyon Junction

Tunnel
No bikes or pedestrians allowed. Large vehicle restrictions.

Unpaved roads are impassable when wet. Smithsonian Butte Scenic Backway may be closed in winter.

Wilderness
In 2009, Congress protected nearly 84 percent of the park as wilderness under the 1964 Wilderness Act. Wilderness designation protects forever the land's wilderness character, natural conditions, opportunities for solitude, and scientific, educational, and historical values.
